THE HOA BOARD LETTER



Thank you to all those homeowners who received letters regarding fence staining and landscape issues and who took the time to correct the problem. This makes the Board's job much easier and also makes our community look nice. We still have a few issues, but the Board and Prescott continue to aggressively pursue solutions and compliance.

If you receive a notice from Prescott, please respond. The majority of misunderstandings are compounded by no response from the homeowner. If you cannot communicate with Prescott, please contact a Board member. Not responding will not make the issue go away.

Check out our new clubhouse floor. The removal of the carpet and installation of tile was completed in June. Hopefully, this will make the clubhouse more functional and accommodate the needs of the community better.

All homeowners should have received the new parking rule. The adoption of this rule will bring the Rules & Regulations in line with an arbitrator's decision dated January 23, 2006. If the rule is adopted by the Board, you will have 45 days to present a petition to Prescott and the Board to

have a change voted on by all 255 homeowners. Adoption of this rule will allow parking in driveways.

What is the Board working on?

- Parking
- A comprehensive set of Rules and Regulations for the community
- The final sign-off with Ryland for our community
- Continued enforcement of the CC&R's and R&R's
- Repairs to the workout room equipment
- A shed for additional storage
- Repairs to the lighting system, both installation of new and maintenance of the old
- The possible hiring of a maintenance company to service our community.

If you have input to any of these issues, please inform Prescott or the Board. We need your input to make Mountain View "a great place to live."

THE GARDENER'S CORNER

From the gardener's corner... Whew! We can expect August to be as hot as July so water, water, water. Water all trees deeply. Pick up and destroy all fallen fruit. **Prune** and destroy dead and diseased limbs, but leave major pruning until winter. Remove bird netting (if you used it) when harvesting is over. If you leave it in place it will become enmeshed in new shoot growth. Stop feeding trees later this month. The cooling weather will harden summer growth to withstand winter's cold.

Prune summer blooming shrubs when they've finished flowering. Shape hedges for the last time this season. Continue shaping roses after pruning suckers, unwanted branches and spent blooms; water deeply.

I'll mention again that if you have **too many tomatoes**, freeze them for winter use. Wash and cut out the core, cut them into quarters and place them on a cookie sheet so they don't touch. When they are frozen transfer them to containers for later use. The skins will slip off when the tomato pieces begin to thaw.

Keep adding **mulch** all summer long to keep roots cool, conserve water, and foil weeds. When it decomposes it enriches the soil.

ZUCCHINI APPETIZERS

Make this yummy zucchini appetizer recipe to use up an abundant zucchini crop.

- 3 cups thinly sliced unpeeled zucchini (4 small)
- 1 cup Original Bisquick® mix
- 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon seasoned salt
- 1/2 teaspoon dried marjoram or oregano leaves
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 1 garlic clove, finely chopped
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 4 eggs, slightly beaten



Heat oven to 350°F. Grease bottom and sides of rectangular pan, 13x9x2 inches. Stir together all ingredients. Spread in pan. Bake about 25 minutes or until golden brown. Cut into 2-inch squares; cut squares diagonally in half into triangles.

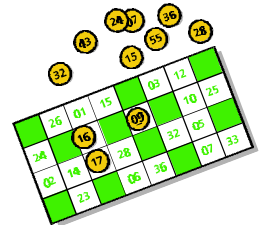
