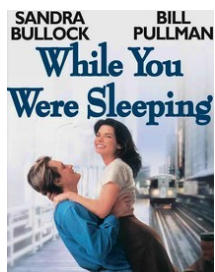

1 Tbs. cream cheese, softened
2 slices angel food cake (3/4 inch thick)
1 to 2 tsp. raspberry preserves
2 tsp. butter, softened
Confectioners sugar

Spread cream cheese on one slice of cake. Spread preserves on second slice. Place slices together, sandwich-style. Spread butter on outsides of the cake . In a large skillet or griddle, toast sandwiches until cake is lightly browned on each side and cream cheese is melted. Dust with confectioners sugar. Serve immediately. Easy to make more.

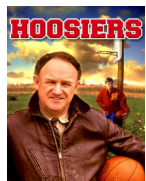

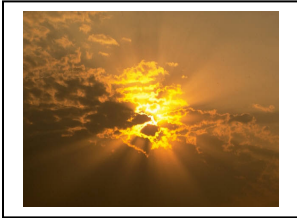
