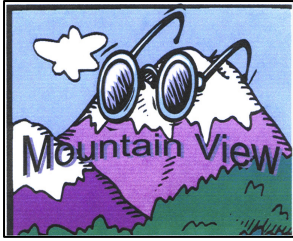

A WORD ABOUT FRONT YARD GRASS BROWN SPOTS

sending landscaping violation letters to homeowners, it's time we look at our lawns. Evidently most of the "brown spots" that have been growing in our yards is due to a fungus. The good news is that it can easily be cured. Ask your gardener or the local lawn specialist at ACE, Home Depot, Lowe's or wherever you get your lawn supplies.

POOL RULES & REGS

Now that the summer months are upon us and the pool will be used by more homeowners, I thought we could go over some of the rules and regulations set up for our pool and spa area.

1. Guests must be accompanied by the hosting homeowner/resident. The maximum number of guests is six (6) per visit.
2. No glass or sharp objects are allowed in the pool or spa.
3. Individuals under 14 years are not allowed in the pool unless accompanied by a responsible adult 21 years of age or older.
4. Incontinent persons, including those in diapers or children who are not toilet trained, are not allowed to use the pool.
5. No soap, bath oils, etc are allowed in the pool or spa. Bathers must shower prior to entering the pool or spa.
6. Diving is not permitted in any area of the pool or spa.
7. No running, pushing or boisterous activity is allowed in or around the pool or spa areas.
8. Radios, cassette/CD players and TV's may be used with earphones only.

9. No wheeled toys or vehicles including skateboards, roller blades, roller skates or bicycles are allowed in the pool or spa area.
10. No smoking is allowed within the fenced boundaries of the pool and spa area.
11. Each resident is responsible for placing his/her (and their guests) litter and debris in the trash receptacles prior to leaving the pool/spa area.
12. No floating or inflatable devices will be permitted in the pool or spa except water wings.
13. No pets are allowed in the pool or spa area at any time except seeing-eye and hearing dogs.
14. Use the pool and spa facilities at your own risk. The association does not employ a lifeguard or other personnel to monitor activities at the pool and therefore cannot be held liable for any injury or damage that may occur.

THE GARDENER'S CORNER

In our hot dry summer months, successful gardening depends on watering and protecting ourselves and our gardens from the heat. We may tend to get involved in our gardening activities and forget that we, like our plants, need to be hydrated. Drink up!

Irrigating your lawns and plants between the hours of 9:00 pm and 6:00 am conforms to the EMWD Stage 2 water requirements and this keeps moisture on grass and plants during the cooler hours. Keep mulch around the plants to help retain moisture. Mulch also, helps keep plant roots cool. Citrus and avocado trees particularly need mulch. Don't be stingy; pile it on. Avocado trees like about three inches.

Trees need periodic deep watering. This encourages more and deeper root development. Trees in grassy areas compete for the available water. Remove the grass around tree trunks and create a shallow well. Inspect the area around trees to see if the roots have the potential of damaging hard-surfaces including sidewalks, patios and walkways.

If there are support stakes around trees, insure that poles and straps are not cutting into tree bark. Stakes are designed to provide temporary tree support. Determine if the tree trunk and root system can survive high winds on their own prior to removing supports. Thinning a dense tree canopy will help trees withstand wind. Pay careful attention to mature pine trees. They tend to have a shallow root system; consider thinning them so they don't topple in high winds.

ARE YOU DISASTER READY?

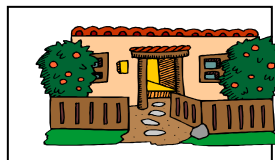
One of the most important things we all need to remember in preparing for potential disasters is to be prepared ourselves. We are less likely to become a victim, and even a barrier to the effectiveness of the disaster response teams, if we are unprepared. By being ready, we can help others who can't help themselves.

The following are a few suggestions to help you succeed in becoming prepared.

1. Get into better physical shape. Being overweight places us more at risk in an emergency situation.
2. Get to know your neighbors - so you can share resources and work as a team.
3. Have a personal pouch for around your waist to keep important paper documents, money, medication, glasses, etc.
4. Have an evacuation plan in place, which will include any physical disabilities as well as the level of danger.
5. Compile an emergency contact list. Use family members who are out of the disaster area because usual communication resources may not be available due to the damage which may be sustained.
