This will make it easier to get from the parking lot to the pool and will allow folks to use the pool while activities are being held in the clubhouse. Additionally, we have a new Ping Pong table. Don't forget to bring your own paddles and balls.

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Mountain View Homeowners Association held its Board of Directors meeting on Wednesday, July 31, 2013.

BOARD ACTION

Board approved minutes of previous meeting. Board approved Financial Statement as of June 30, 2013

 Reserve Funds
 \$ 766,685.20

 Operating Funds
 \$ 68,595.91

 Operating Income/(Loss)
 \$ 5,501.21

 Y-T-D Reserve Funding:
 \$ 83,275.78

Reviewed Delinquency Status Report:

As of June 30, 2013, the Association reports a total of \$2,156.98 in delinquent assessments. This figure represents an approximate 2% delinquency rate. The delinquency rate for June 2013 was an approximate 1.06%.

New Business:

- Attorney authorized by the Board to issue Intent to Lien Letters.
- Board approved Bad Debt write-off for Account Number 0112-01 in the amount of \$15.00.
- Board reviewed Violation Report.
- Board approved the Architectural Committee minutes dated June 24, 2013.
- Board approved the establishment of a Communications Committee to include: Newsletter, Web-site & Wi-Fi maintenance.
- Board accepts with regret the resignation of Fran Martinez from the Landscape Committee.
- Board accepts with regret the Request for Suspension of Eunice Kang from the Facilities Committee.
- Board places on hold until further notice of bids for a Bocce Ball Court, Shuffle Board Court or a Horse Shoe Pit.
- Board discussed the Clubhouse Rental Agreement. The rental is \$150.00 for first four (4) hours and \$50.00 for each additional rental hour. There was a proposal for the rental to be lowered to \$100.00 for the first four (4) hours and \$50.00 for each additional rental hour. Since the monies collected from the rental are given to the Social Club, management was asked to speak with the Social Club officers for their opinion.
- Board discussed the Wi-Fi access at the clubhouse. Darryl Householder was asked to: 1) open the access to just a password and 2) to procure the needed items to extend the range for the Wi-Fi to the pool area. Password to the Mountain View HOA is mv28855ch.
- Board discussed bids to: 1) install a hand rail at stairs to fireplace area and 2) fireplace landing clay tile staining; management was
 asked to procure additional estimates.
- Ping Pong table was delivered to clubhouse. Management to ask ProTec to install a security bolt before it is placed outside.

Board to discuss shades for the windows in the fitness center.



I have met so many wonderful people and feel very blessed to have so many new friends. I'm hoping to bring you some of my gardening tips. I have lived in 11 different homes and in 7 different states. So needless to say, I have experienced all different types of weather. If you have any thoughts or suggestions please send them my way.

In our zone fall is a wonderful time in your garden. You can plant almost everything in late September. The soil is still warm and roots will get a head start before the winter rains start. Think about buying and planting Spring bulbs while the selection is at its best. Choose "plump" bulbs. Divide your Iris plants that have been around for awhile or they will stop blooming. Repair lawn and reseed to produce new growth. Use 0-10-10 fertilizer for Camellias and Azalea plants. Cut back, trim and feed roses. Roses will require severe pruning in December.

Jo Ann's Frittata

Ingredients:

<i>1-2</i>	Red peppers cut into small pieces
6	Large potatoes cut into cubes
1	Large onion cut into small pieces

8-12 Eggs, beaten

1 cup Romano grated cheese1 cup Mozzarella finely grated

34 cup Oil

1 tsp. Black pepper

½ tsp. Salt

1 tlbs. Soy sauce

In a large frying pan, put oil enough to cover bottom of pan. Add peeled & cubed potatoes until browned; add onions, peppers & spy sauce until browned. Cook on high heat for cartelization.

In Bowl: Beat eggs and add both cheeses, black pepper. Mix well. When veggies are to your liking, add in egg batter. Evenly distribute around pan. Lower to medium heat and cover. When top looks done, it will be dry, flip over into cover and back into pan to brown other side. This ca be a little tricky! (HINT: use shallow cover or flip into plate and then back into pan.) Serve warm or at room temperature, even cold! ENJOY!

SECURITY DOORS

As most of you are aware our community has had some serious security issues. As a consequence, members of the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) have been asked a number of questions regarding security screen doors. Hopefully, this article will address those questions.

Screen Door v/s Security Screen Door

There is a difference. A simple, lightweight screen door fits within an outside doorway in order to admit air and exclude insects. Often it will have a lock but typically does not offer a great deal of security because it can be easily cut through. A security screen door offers enhanced forced-entry deterrence. The heavy-duty frame is combined with forged-steel pickets (posts) and strong, metal mesh that cannot be easily damaged. Be sure to discuss the difference when choosing a door.

A Choice of Door Designs

Home Depot and Lowe's offer many choices in security screen doors. Please note there are already established *color* guidelines for front screen doors. However, because of the number of available design patterns in security doors the ARC has established guidelines for selecting one. You will need to provide a picture of the door design with the ARC Home Improvement Form. A pictorial list of acceptable choices can be found on the bulletin board at the clubhouse. Or, if you
